
# FOSTER YOUTH EDUCATION RIGHTS







#### 1. RIGHT TO REMAIN IN YOUR SCHOOL OF ORIGIN

## 3. RIGHT TO PARTIAL CREDITS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

- If you change schools during the school year, you
  have a right to part al credits in all classes that you are
  passing when you leave your old school, even if you do
  not complete the ent re class.
- Af er you change schools, your new school must accept the part al credits issued by your old school.
- Af er you change schools, you have the right to be enrolled in #theysamlastrssimoidalr classes you were
- You cannot be forced to retake a class or part of a class that you have already completed with a passing grade, if it would make you of -track for high school graduat on.
- You have the right to take or retake any class that you need to go to a California State University or University of California.
- Your grade cannot be lowered because you were absent frountschool for a court hearing, placement change, or a -related act vity.

### 2. RIGHT TO IMMEDIATE ENROLLMENT IN SCHOOL

- You have the right to immediately enroll in your regular home school af er you move placements.
- You cannot be forced to at end a cont nuat on school or other alternative education program, such as independent study, even if you are behind in credits or have discipline problems at school.
- You have a right to immediately enroll in school and begin at ending classes, even if you do not have the paperwork you would normally need for enrollment 167/21 (such as birth cert f cate, transcript, or IEP) or you did not check-out from your previous school.
- Your previous school must send your educat on records to your new school af er you enroll.
- You have the right to part cipate in any act vit es available at your new school, such as sports teams, tutoring, or af er-school clubs, even if you miss a tryout or sign-up deadline.

## 4. GRADUATION RIGHTS

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- If you are behind on your credits, and you transferred schools af er 10th grade, you may be eligible to graduate under AB 167/216 by completing only the state graduation requirements (130 credits in specific dasses) instt on
