CLASS TITLE: PAINTER

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of the Director- Facilities, Maintenance and Operations, perform a variety of journey-level duties in the painting of designated buildings and facilities and preparation of related surfaces; mix and apply paints or other surface coatings to buildings, equipment and furniture; perform general maintenance and repairs on equipment utilized in trade. Assist other personnel in performing general building maintenance duties as required
